STATE-MANDATED CME CONTENT REQUIREMENTS

CME Requirements At-A-Glance

Renewal Cycle:

Annual - License renewals due by March 1

State-Mandated CME Requirements:

- <u>60 CME every three years</u>
- Minimum of 30 Category 1 CME
- <u>3 Domestic Violence (Primary Care Physicians)</u>
- <u>4.5 Prescribing Controlled Substance</u>
- <u>12 Addiction Medicine</u>
- <u>1 Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma</u>

State-Mandated CME Content Detail

All physicians must complete 60 hours of CME every three years, 30 of which must be certified in AMA Category 1 by an organization accredited by the ACCME. The current three-year CME Cycle is January 1, 2018 to December 31, 2020. Physicians authorized to prescribe or dispense controlled substances in Kentucky must complete 4.5 hours of Board approved Category 1 CME relating to the use of KASPER, pain management, addiction disorders, or a combination of two or more of those subjects. Each DEA-licensed prescriber of Buprenorphine-Mono-Product or Buprenorphine-Combined-with- Naloxone shall complete at least twelve (12) hours of continuing medical education certified in Category 1 specific to addiction medicine each three-year renewal cycle. Primary care physicians, who are granted licensure after July 1, 1996, are required to successfully complete a three (3) hour domestic violence training course within 3 years of the date of initial licensure. Pediatricians, radiologists, family practitioners. and emergency medicine and urgent care physicians must complete a onetime one (1) hour of training on Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma within 5 years of licensure. Physicians are advised to confirm Kentucky's requirements with the

Kentucky Board of Medical

Licensure.
