NEW MEXICO (DO) STATE-MANDATED CME CONTENT REQUIREMENTS

CME Requirements At-A-Glance

Renewal Cycle:

Annual renewal on or before July 1

State-Mandated CME Requirements:

- <u>75 Category 1 CME every three years</u>
- <u>6 Pain Management</u>

State-Mandated CME Content Detail

The New Mexico board of osteopathic medical examiners requires licensees complete seventy-five (75) hours of Category I continuing education every three years. At least 30 must be earned through AOA 1A/1B activities. These may be distributed over the three-year period, or they may all be obtained in one year. The board accepts one (1) credit hour for every clock hour of participation in a CME activity. The board will also accept active membership in the AOA; Certification or Recertification by a specialty board during the three-year cycle; or, Passage of the SPEX with a score of 75 during the three-year cycle. New Mexico osteopathic physicians who hold a federal drug enforcement administration registration and controlled substance licensure shall complete no less than six continuing medical education hours addressing Pain Management. Physicians are advised to confirm New Mexico's current DO requirements with the Board of
